



SOAHAC-Windsor COVID-19 Screening and Testing Services Information for Professionals

SOAHAC is offering COVID-19 screening and testing to First Nations, Métis, and Inuit (FNMI) people in Windsor. Screening is done over the phone M-F 8:30-4:30, and testing is by appointment at 1405 Tecumseh Road West in Windsor. If you work with the FNMI community, please share the attached Community Notice. The following is meant to inform you of our process so that you can make appropriate referrals and answer any questions.

Local First Nations, Metis and Inuit, status and non-status community members (do not have to be clients of SOAHAC) who suspect that they have signs and symptoms of COVID-19 can call SOAHAC 519-916-1755 for screening over the telephone.

A health care provider at SOAHAC will ask the community member for information about their symptoms, gather personal health information, and complete a Ministry of Health screening assessment tool as per Ministry guidelines.

Based on screening, we will advise the community member to self-isolate and/or provide an appointment date and time for the COVID-19 testing (Nasopharyngeal Swab) to be completed. We will not accept walk-ins.

People coming to their testing appointment at 1405 Tecumseh Rd. W. will be asked to park and remain in their vehicle. The parking site for COVID-19 testing is located at the back of the building (south side), off of Everts Ave. The arrival spot is marked with an arrow and park here sign. Those arriving on foot should wait in this spot, or under the white canopy if it is raining.



A SOAHAC staff will greet the community member, complete the test and provide health teaching about self-isolation, self-monitoring, and isolation guide for caregivers and family from Public Health Ontario.

Community members will receive a discharge information sheet which includes instructions on how to obtain test results.

If community member has mobility issues; arrangements may be made to support in-home testing. Please call to arrange this.

Any positive findings of COVID-19 will be followed up by Public Health – Windsor Essex County Health Unit.
