We strive to provide quality, wholistic health services by sharing and promoting traditional and western health practices to enable people to live in a more balanced state of well-being. The Centre provides services to Indigenous people including those who live on and off reserve, status, non-status, Inuit, and Metis within the Southwest, Waterloo Wellington and Erie St. Clair regions. SOAHAC has a mandate of ensuring that health services are accessible, of high quality, and are culturally appropriate. We are also mandated to build health care capacity within Indigenous communities. Currently, we are seeking the services of a **Family Service Worker Student** to join our London Site interdisciplinary team.

The **Family Services Worker Student** assists in supporting families accessing food programming and promoting nutritious eating, as well as supporting other SOAHAC services.

Requirements:

- Post-secondary education or related education such as Social Worker or Social Services, health promotion, dietary aide, food and nutrition, or equivalent
- Experience working in an Indigenous community or with Indigenous families
- Community work or volunteer experience with families to improve wellness, and empowerment in the following areas: poverty issues, housing, social assistance an asset
- Knowledgeable about Western and Indigenous models of care an asset
- Awareness of Health and Wellness issues pertaining to FNIM People.
- Excellent computer skills
- Experience in electronic medical records an asset
- Able to maintain confidential and sensitive information
- Attention to detail and accuracy
- Able to work in a fast-paced environment
- Must obtain current and clear police check
- Up-to-date immunizations and records
- Able to work will with minimal supervision
- Must meet requirements set out by Canada Summer Jobs

Responsibilities may include the following:

- Assist with the Minomode-zewin nunge-gehwin “healthy ways of eating” Food Program
- Assist with packing, sorting, distribution of food and basic needs items to clients daily
- Maintain inventory list and working with local food suppliers

- Work with the Dietitian to create promotional material, recipes, nutrition information, etc. to be included in the boxes
- Respond to food hub program telephone messages
- Deliver effective client services
- Offer program support and delivery for social work, dietitian, cultural programs
- Other tasks to support the staff team as assigned

This job may require additional responsibilities and duties as assigned by Southwest Ontario Aboriginal Health Access Centre.

This is a temporary summer student position which is funded by the Canada Summer Jobs Program. This is subject to funding and eligible applications must meet the criteria of the program to be considered.
