Reporting to the **Integrated Care Manager(s)**, the **Chiroprapist** is a member of an inter-professional team who performs, assesses, diagnoses, treats, provides counselling, health education, and other clinical foot care activities according to the College of Chiroprapists of Ontario.

Requirements

- Diploma from a recognized school of chiroprapody
- Current registration with the College of Chiroprapists of Ontario, without limitations
- Experience as a chiroprapist in a community health or hospital setting is an asset
- Experience in program development, implementation, monitoring and evaluation an asset
- Proficiency in the use of computers and various software applications, including software used by the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care
- Able to work in a fast-paced environment
- Able to respond in a positive way to demanding issues and project a welcoming, friendly personality
- Able to work well within a multi-disciplinary team environment
- Participates in staff development and team meetings as requested
- Travel within London and area, as well as, SOAHAC sites as required
- Access to reliable transportation
- Willingness to participate in Indigenous Cultural Safety Training, teachings and ceremonies.
- Clean and current police check as a condition of employment
- Up to date immunizations and records
- Have a valid 'G' license and access to a reliable vehicle, as schedule will flex between both sites

Responsibilities

- Ensures chiroprody resources, materials and equipment are maintained
- Contributes to chart documentation, participates in chart reviews and case conferences, and makes referrals where appropriate
- Participates in the development, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of treatment, education
- Counseling and health promotion programs for individuals, families and the community
